



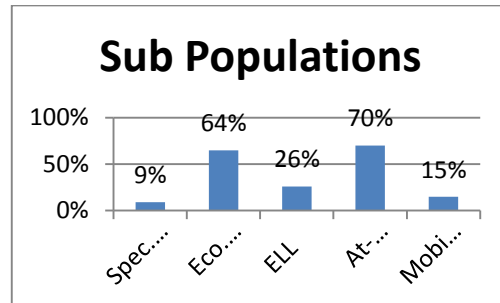
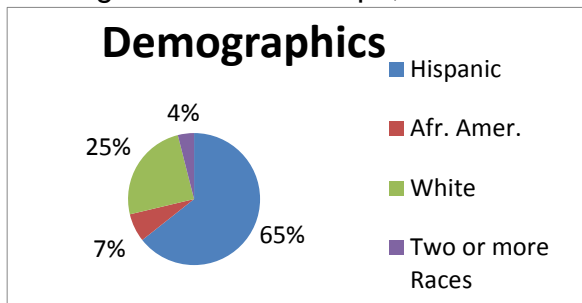

Crestview's spring 2016 STAAR scores at phase 1 were all above 90% in reading and mathematics; writing 89%; science 87%. Additionally, Crestview earned all six distinctions-Reading/ELA, Science, Mathematics, Top 25% Student Progress, Top 25% Closing Performance Gaps, and Postsecondary Readiness.

Crestview was named a TEA Title I, Building Capacity Reward School in 2016 from among 6,000 schools statewide, only 350 of which have been designated by TEA as a Title I Reward School. From that select group, six were chosen by a committee of educators to be highlighted on video. Crestview was selected and highlighted for their increased learning time. Crestview faculty and staff all contribute to student success. Crestview currently staffs 4 RTI teachers, 2 Dyslexia teachers, and 2 Special Education teachers. Campus administrators work with intervention groups weekly, to help increase academic achievement. Interventions begin early and remain consistent throughout the school year.
